Fear, anxiety, and phobias

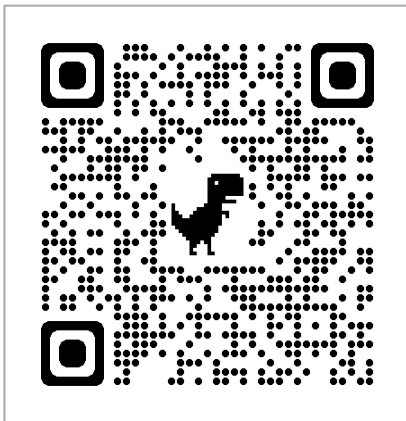

Understanding the cognitive and neural processes underlying these related emotional states is critical for the diagnosis and treatment of a variety of associated anxiety disorders.
